

1) The Importance of Independence and Interdependence in Adolescents and Adults • Garden State Ballroom • BACB Anya Silver, M.A., BCBA, Hofstra University and Lauren Goodwyn, M.A., BCBA; both Quality Services for the Autism Community

One of the greatest challenges is promoting independence in the individuals we serve so that they can live the best quality of life possible. However, the sometimes overlooked area of interdependence may be even more crucial for success in daily life. Individuals with autism may attempt to behave independently when they actually would be better served by accessing others to help them to solve a problem. The relevance of independence and interdependence will be discussed across a number of domains such as social skills, communication, vocational, leisure, health and safety, and daily living skills.

2) Building Compliant and Effective Transition Plans • Essex Ballroom



As you may be aware, friend of Autism New Jersey and the workshop's planned speaker, Ira Fingles, Esq. passed away suddenly on January 20. We thank Ira's friend and colleague, Hillary Freeman, Esq. of Freeman Law Offices for filling in as presenter for this workshop on short notice.

Many of the problems that educators, parents, and others involved in the educational process face can be avoided by simply ensuring strict compliance with the procedures and rules about how to develop students' IEPs. These rules are structured and sequenced to build off of one another and to lead the IEP team to the correct result. Learn the mandatory components of an appropriate transition plan; the function of each in the student's educational experience; how they build upon one another and other IEP components; transition planning myth vs. reality; and best practices for developing compliant and effective transition plans.

3) Medication Boot Camp: A Behavior Analyst's Guide to Psychotropic Medications • Mercer/Salem/Warren Ballroom • APA • BACB

This workshop will provide a review of psychotropic medication classes, including new medications that have come to market, with a focus on how to evaluate the effects of medications from a behavior analytic perspective. The topic of genetic testing and its potential utility in the prescription of psychotropic medication will also be discussed. Educational content will be presented by a psychiatric prescriber with experience working with individuals with high-risk challenging behavior and behavior analysts.

4) Key Questions When Selecting or Creating a Program for Individuals with Challenging Behavior • Garden State Ballroom • BACB Lisa McCauley Parles, Esq., Parles Rekem & National Council on Severe Autism and Alexandra Held, M.S.Ed., BCBA, Elwyn

This workshop will address components of programs for individuals with autism and severe challenging behaviors in an effort to create collaborative and effective programs. It is intended to assist caregivers in selecting programs and to support professionals seeking to create models well suited to this population. National initiatives and housing models will be presented along with a discussion of state and federal regulations. Topics will include the role of BCBAs; tracking progress for both behavior support plans and skill acquisition programs; video recording for monitoring and training purposes; parental engagement and rights; and innovative construction design.

7) Adults with Autism Using Technology: Support for Promoting Independence and Quality of Life • Mercer/Salem/Warren Ballroom • APA • BACB

Thomas Zane, Ph.D., BCBA-D, University of Kansas

Adults with autism and other developmental disabilities often need supportive systems to maintain, to the greatest extent possible, independence, choice, and integration into their communities. The current (and future) sophistication of technology lends itself to providing support in areas that in the past had to be supplied completely by staff. This workshop will review a variety of technological solutions to everyday situations that often are important to solve with individuals with ASD. Data will be presented to demonstrate evaluations of some technology designed to be used in innovative ways.

8) Your Child Turned 18: Now What? • Garden State Ballroom Gabrielle Bohon, Esq. and Raymond Falcon, Jr., Esq.; *Falcon Law Group*

Once your child turns 18, the rules change. First, the child is legally emancipated, which means that schools, doctors and financial institutions shouldn't talk with you. Do you need guardianship, Power of Attorney and Advanced Health Care Directive? We will walk you through other programs that may be available, such as Supplemental Security Income (SSI), Medicaid, Social Security Disability (SSD), and Social Security Childhood Disability Benefits (also known as Disabled Adult Child benefits). We will also look at a number of alternate paths and the government services that are available, such as 504 Plans, NJ Children's System of Care, Division of Developmental Disabilities, Division of Vocational Rehabilitation, Project SEARCH, and adult day programs. We will provide some practical tips on dealing with these issues.


